We are having a Celebration of Life and Exhibition for Beverly Michael’s husband, Jimmie W. Evans, on Saturday, November 30 from 2 – 4 pm. Mr. Evans studied Fine Art at UNM in the mid 1970s. A veteran, he served for three years in Vietnam as a medic. His colorful paintings, while quite large, evoke a sense of peaceful happiness; one wants to spend time with them. He was born in 1948 and died in 2023. He grew up here in Grants and is remembered by many friends.

RICHARD YAZZIE

As we are honoring both veterans and Indigenous people during this month, artist Richard Yazzie's work is a must see at the Double Six Gallery. He's a Vietnam Veteran who lives in Jamestown, and has been a painter, muralist, illustrator, and graphic designer. He was sent to Crownpoint Boarding School when he was six years old. After high school he attended the San Francisco Art Institute, then went on to the Institute of American Indian Arts in Santa Fe, where he completed his studies in sculpture, graphic design, pottery, metal-working, woodwork and silversmithing. After graduation from IAIA, he was offered a scholarship to an art school in London but was drafted by the Army before he was able to accept. We are pleased to display his paintings as part of our latest show, *Shadows Fall*.
